
Natyanjali 2021




Sustenance through Performing Arts

Nihaarika Donthenini: A compassionate dancer who never forgot to remain grateful to her parents for all their relentless support, was thoughtful enough to extend a 'return gift' to her parents in the form of an exclusive dance performance on the occasion of her parent's wedding anniversary.

Industry Connect Program

An unprecedented growth in the Indian Economy for almost a decade now, has put up a huge challenge for the academia to produce quality students, to meet the hustle of both the Corporate and Entrepreneurial demands.

India is the fourth-largest unicorn base in the world with over 21 unicorns collectively valued at US\$ 73.2 billion, as per the Hurun Global Unicorn List. By 2025, India is expected to have ~100 unicorns which will create ~1.1 million direct jobs - according to the Nasscom-Zinnov report 'Indian Tech Start-up'. As a result, India needs to increase its rate of employment growth and create 90 million non-farm jobs between 2023 and 2030, for productivity and economic growth - according to McKinsey Global Institute. Net employment rate needs to grow by 1.5% per year from 2023 to 2030 to achieve 8-8.5% GDP growth.

While we have a huge target before us, a linear way of growth in terms of adding more Universities, finishing schools, other infrastructure expansions etc., can take us to a certain point. But unfortunately, this kind of a model is not scalable.

Worldwide, it is proven that artists have a holistic approach to deal with a given circumstance. It is important to tap the creative minds and give them a platform to interact with the Industry with real time operational scenarios, which not only helps them to upgrade their intellectual capital, but also rally themselves, to cope up with the incessant demands of the Industry. In parallel, the Industry too, is so welcoming to explore creative minds from performing arts institutions, that they feel - such minds can help them in employee retention and drive the company's growth taking a transformative approach.

Going forward, UCPA has lined up exciting engagement models with the Industry & Academia - which not only contributes in extending an interactive platform for its students, but also introducing an integrated performing arts platform "ANTARANG.
