

Industry Connect Program

Prof. Manish Singhal

Many of us tend to multi-task to stay ahead in time and assume that it is the only way to be in the race. But little did we realise that it does more harm than good - Prof. Manish Singhal, Organizational Behavior, XLRI, Jamshedpur said, whilst addressing a curated group of UCPAians on the 30th of Oct 2021.



Prof. Manish Singhal started the session by addressing the audience on how and why, to clear the space while shifting from one task to another.

He walked the audience through the consequences and efficiencies associated when one multi-tasks and urged us to get rid of our misconceptions that multi-tasking is always the key to a higher productivity.


The Professor then went on to display an 'emotional matrix' and explained us on the unpredictable emotions that we come across in our daily lives. He believes that we individuals are trying to juggle between two different worlds: "Outer and Inner". He asserted that it is important to maintain a clear and calm center from within to manage the outer part of the world.

Indeed, we frequently tend to ignore the emotions we encounter in our society, relationships, organizations, etc. Prof. Manish Singhal reminded us that we humans are not emotion-free and ignored emotions are disruptive in nature. It is the emotional intelligence that makes one unique and the intelligence lies in managing and sailing through such emotions.

He had taken a few references to explain the individual behavior in a very interactive and jovial manner.

He talked about the typical and mindful ways to deal with emotions and ended the session with a powerful thought to ponder upon - 'It is not the water outside of the boat that sinks it but the one in it' added Prof.Manish - thus coaching us on managing uncertainties from a place of unshakable calm.

On a whole, it was a very thought-provoking session where the audience got to revisit some of the basic nuances of daily lives.

Stage Performances

Telangana Sangeeta Nataka Akademi

The majesty of an open-air auditorium, flashing lights, music in the background, sound of bells around the feet and an audience edging on their seats to watch UCPA roar: were all, multiple icings on a cake.



Being a performing arts institution and despite getting many offers, live stage performances were put on hold completely by UCPA for over 20 months owing to the pandemic. Health and safety is utmost paramount to the institution and we cant afford any negligence in this regard. The patient wait finally came to an end in November 2021 when UCPA accepted the invitation from the Telangana Sangeeta Nataka Akademi to perform in the 'Festival of Classical Music and Dance', a three-day festival organized in collaboration with the Department of Language and Culture, Telangana, South Zone Cultural Centre, Thanjavur and Shilparamam Arts, Crafts and Cultural Society, Uppal, Telangana.

Team UCPA performed on the 27th of Nov 2021 at Mini - Shilparamam, Uppal, Hyderabad. Eleven UCPAians including Geetha Ganesan, Rishika, Navya, Subhanvitha, Lasyanjali, Sanjana, Dhruthika, Bhavika, Joshnavi, Yoshitha and Hasini performed in this festival.

The program was well received by the audience. The Chief Guest for the evening, Sri Mukteshwara Rao, IAS (Retd.) was highly appreciative of the performances and congratulated Team UCPA on this occasion. The Guest of Honor, a senior artiste and a Kuchipudi exponent Dr. Bhagavathula Sethuram, Professor (Retd.) Potti Sreeramulu Telugu University showered his blessings on the artists and said that the future of this art form is safe in the hands of both UCPA and Geetha Ganesan.

Once the pandemic subsides and the Government of India declares safety, UCPA shall be delighted to embrace live stage shows. Until then, UCPA shall hand pick the live shows owing to the safety of all UCPAians and abide by the safety regulations.





Kalanubhav Series

Ms. Tina Tambe - Kathak Exponent

As part of the knowledge enhancement programs for the UCPAians, the Kalanubhav series was introduced by UCPA in the previous quarter, to explore and provide knowledge on the diverse art forms and the culture associated with them. As part of this, the first session was on Manipuri and the second session, presented in this quarter, was on yet another Indian Classical Dance form, Kathak.

Dr. Tina Tambe, a well-known Kathak exponent, Director- Ninad Centre for Performing Arts, was invited to give a lecture demonstration and introduce this beautiful dance form to the UCPAians. She is a Doordarshan 'A' grade artist and holds a PhD from Vikram University (Ujjain) for her research work on 'Dance elements in Meera's poetry' - in the context of Kathak.



Dr. Tina walked the audience through the evolution of Kathak - from the erstwhile 'Kathakars' (the storytellers) to the present day Kathak dancers. The changes and transformations that Kathak underwent during various reigns, the influence of Mughal period, Bhakti Movement, evolution of the different Gharanas (styles), their characteristics, features, costumes, format of presentation, music, etc. were well illustrated in detail by Dr. Tina, in her two-hour long presentation.

The session concluded with a live demonstration by Dr. Tina. There was also an interactive session that followed as the students were seen cheerfully engaged in learning a few steps of Kathak from the exponent, herself.

Received very well by all the participants - no doubt, this kind of an experiential learning will truly help the UCPAians to understand and appreciate the art forms much better, in the times to come.

UDVIGNA - National Dance Festival
